Letter from the Founder and President

Dear Friends,

We hope that this newsletter finds you and your family thriving. We have had a very busy 2008 and are happy to give you an update. My daughter, Zoe Rowley-Mobley age 9, and I went to Kenya in August, 2008 to visit with the children. I am so very proud of her. She introduced arts and crafts to the children which went exceptionally well. At that time, I was able to view the current status of the new building, provide you with recent pictures, and meet with a few contractors (for the new building) and engineers (to create a borehole - water system) in an effort to gather cost to complete these two most important projects. The reported costs to complete the new building and create a borehole-water system are \$33,000.00 US Dollars and an unknown amount, respectively. The water system is unknown at this time because engineers charge by the meter and they are not sure how far down they would have to dig in order to hit water. Though we are still raising funds for a much needed water system, this will be an on going project for me as I learn all I can from engineers and organizations that provide such a system. I am most hopeful that this sum of \$33,000.00 is achievable and with your help and prayers, can be achieved prior to our next trip in August, 2009.



On Sunday, October 12, 2008, we had a FUNdraising day at Hermosa Beach for the Triathlon. Though the morning was a bit chilly, the sun poured down on those who swam the cold Pacific Ocean, biked their way up and down hills and ran the last leg for Machao. We raised a total of \$875.00 for the borehole. I would like to thank Jessica Forsberg for her dedication as a volunteer and wonderful idea as well as the participants who ran, cycled and swam for Machao.

We are pleased to be able to give you all the opportunity to learn more about Machao through our DVD.
